1. Introduction

The Government of St. Kitts and Nevis, as part of the Sustainable Road Safety Project, is seeking proposals from qualified firms or consortia to design, develop, and implement a high-tech automatic traffic ticketing solution. This system will integrate advanced technologies such as cameras and speed detectors to monitor traffic violations in real-time and facilitate the issuance of traffic tickets for speeding and other infractions. The initiative aligns with our long-term vision of achieving zero road fatalities by 2030 through the enhancement of road safety and enforcement capabilities.

2. Objectives of the RFP

The objective of this project is to procure a turnkey solution that will:

- Detect and document speeding violations and traffic light violations automatically using reliable technology.
- Generate real-time evidence to support traffic ticketing processes.
- Encourage compliance with speed limits and traffic laws.
- Provide insights into traffic behavior to guide future infrastructure and policy improvements.

3. Scope of Work

The successful bidder will be responsible for delivering a comprehensive system that includes:

1. Hardware Procurement and Installation

- High-resolution cameras capable of capturing license plate details.
- Speed detection devices with accuracy certifications.
- Integration of traffic lights with monitoring equipment where applicable.
- 2. Software Development and Integration



- Real-time data processing to capture evidence of violations (images, speed measurements).
- Automatic ticket generation linked to license plate details.
- Secure database for storing violation records.

3. System Features

- Real-time alerts for violations to relevant authorities.
- Data analytics and reporting capabilities.

4. Compliance with Legal Standards

- Ensure compliance with privacy and data protection laws of St. Kitts and Nevis.
- \circ Develop workflows to integrate the system with local law enforcement protocols.

5. Training and Support

- o Conduct training sessions for traffic law enforcement officers and administrative staff.
- Provide post-implementation support and maintenance for five years.

Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

1. Technical Feasibility (40%)



- Functionality, scalability, and reliability of the proposed system.
- 2. Cost Effectiveness (30%)
 - Affordability and value for money.

3. Experience and Qualifications (20%)

• Proven track record in delivering similar projects.

4. Implementation Timeline (10%)

• Ability to meet project deadlines.
